Options are given when the following is known from the applicant's answers to the questions: He fully explained the content of the questions; The content of laws and concepts is fully explained, terms are used correctly and appropriately; He used additional materials and science news to cover the content; Observations and experiments were used to prove the idea, the results of which were expressed in the form of tables and diagrams. 86-100 points. 2) The applicant's answers to alternative questions are set when the following is known: He/she did not follow consistency in fully explaining the content of the questions; certain shortcomings were allowed in clarifying the content of laws and concepts, ambiguities were allowed in the use of terms; He made a mistake in clarifying the content and proving his opinion, reporting the results of observations and experiments. 71-85 points. 3) Options are set when the following is known from the entrant's answers to the questions: He did not follow consistency in fully covering the content of the questions; If there are serious deficiencies in clarifying the content of laws and concepts, if the rules of using terms are not followed; 56-70 points. 4) Options are given when the following is known from the answers given by the applicant to the questions: He did not fully explain the content of the questions; He made gross



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mistakes in clarifying the content of laws, concepts, and using terms. 0-55 points. When the master's entrance examinations are conducted in the form of a test, each student is given 50 tests, and each correct answer is evaluated with a total of 100 points from 2 points.
